Our first half term has been full of activities and pupils are now settled into their new routines. It has been lovely to hear the children talk about what they have been learning and the subjects that they are finding fun. Well done Griffins– a super start to 2022-2023– we are so proud of you!

Trips, events and enrichment and extra-curricular (Wide Horizons) provision is already underway and this includes the welcome return of the GSF (Griffin Sports Festival). We are really proud of the year 6 pupils who represented us and brought home bronze medals.

Years 5 and 1 have been on class visits to RAF Cosford and Dudley Castle where they had a wonderful time. The visits have inspired some fantastic learning. This week year 6 have undertaken a 'Prep for Learning' trip to The Liverpool Maritime Museum where they have been immersed in the tragic sinking of the RMS Titanic.
