Bramford Parents and Friends Association splashed out on Saturday 17th June organising the first Colour Run to be held at Bramford.


The day was a huge success, and everyone had a brilliant time. The paint was definitely flying around and we all got thoroughly messy. Especially the staff and volunteers!
